When I watched films of working in Iron Girders high above the street, I shook my head. That wasn't for me. I couldn't even imagine being in such a place.

Then, I watched a special on the Discovery Channel about Nik Wallenda trying to cross the Grand Canyon on a tightrope. He planned to do it without any safety equipment, carrying only a balance pole. I'd heard of the Wallenda's before. The family had lost two members in a balancing act fall, and Nik's grandfather had died while trying to cross a high wire between two buildings.

The camera panned along the cable that was strung between the two cliffs, such a long way down, I felt queasy just looking at eh canyon. It seemed impossible that anyone could walk so far on a six inch wire cable.

Nik Wallenda did it, though. He wore a helmet camera along with a two-way radio that his father used to give encouragement and advice. Step by step, Nik crossed the gap.

Once the vibration caused by his walk began to build, and he had to kneel until the cable settled down. When Nik reached a few score feet from solid ground, he broke into a run and finished.

I was fascinated by the show. I pictured myself on a tightrope, balance bar in hand, one foot after the other as I made it to the finish. If the image was any distance from the ground, though, I wouldn't make it. I'd fall. Even in imagination, I dislikes heights.

That's ok. It was Nik's faith and determination that impressed me. I've reached a place where walking from one end of the hallway and back is as much an adventure as any I've had. When you do all you all you can, that's enough.

# Recipe of the Month. <br> Hot Fudge Ice Cream Bars 

## Ingredients:

1 (16oz.) Chocolate syrup
3/4 cup peanut butter
19 ice cream sandwiches


1 (12 oz.) frozen whipped topping
1 cup salted peanuts

## Directions:

1. Pour the chocolate syrup into a medium microwave safe bowl and microwave 2 minutes on high. Do not allow to boil. Stir peanut butter into hot chocolate until smooth. Allow to cool to room temperature.
2. Line the bottom of 9 xl 3 inch dish with a layer of ice cream sandwiches. Spread half the whipped topping over the sandwiches. Spoon half the chocolate mixture over that. Top with half the peanuts. Repeat layers. Freeze until firm, lhour. Cut into squares to serve.
